

DICK GROENENDYK
Funeral services were held June 11, 1977 at the Third Reformed church, Pella, for Dick Groenendyk, 85, who died June 9 at the Pella community nursing home.

Mr. Groenendyk married Josie Van Haften June 28, 1919 at Pella. They lived in the Tracy-Bussey area until 1952 when they moved to Pella. Until 1975 they lived in town, then moved to the Hilltop Manor where they lived for two years. The last three months of their lives they lived in Griffin nursing center, Knoxville and the Pella community nursing home.

While living in Pella, Mr. Groenendyk was employed by the Marion county weed commission.

He is survived by two children: Angeline, Mrs. Delos Van Den Berg and Elmer M. Groenendyk, both of rural Pella; 13 grandchildren and 19 great-grandchildren, and one brother, Eldert Groenendyk of rural Tracy. Preceding him in death are his wife, May 23, 1977, his parents, his oldest daughter, Mary Ann, Mrs. Henry G. Roozeboom, grandson Duane Henry Roozeboom, and the following brothers and sisters: Ben Groenendyk, St. Peter, Wilhelm, Sijgie and Marie, Mrs. Bert Denburger.

Mr. Groenendyk made profession of his faith at the Ebenezer Reformed Church, Leighton and while living in the Bussey area belonged to the Tracy Christian Reformed church, Tracy. He was a member of the Third Reformed church of Pella.

Reformed Church General Synod in Sioux Center

Sioux Center will be the setting for the 171st General Synod of the Reformed Church in America. The session began June 13 and will close on the evening of the 17th with communion and the installation of Rev. Arie R. Brouwer as General Secretary. Mr. Brouwer follows Dr. Marion de Velder, who is retiring after 17 years of service in this position.

The five-day meeting will be co-hosted by Central Reformed Church and First Reformed church of Sioux Center. The latter, celebrating its 100th birthday this year, is presenting a Centennial Pageant on Tuesday evening in the Te Paske Theater.

Other highlights of the week include the report of Dr. Louis H. Benes, outgoing President of General Synod, the election of new officers for the year 1977-78, and the report of the General Program Council. The Theological Commission will present its statement on the Unification Church of Sun Myung Moon and the recommendation to study the place of children at the Lord's table. A presentation of a task force of Reformed Church Women reviewing the opportunities for women in the denomination is also on the agenda.

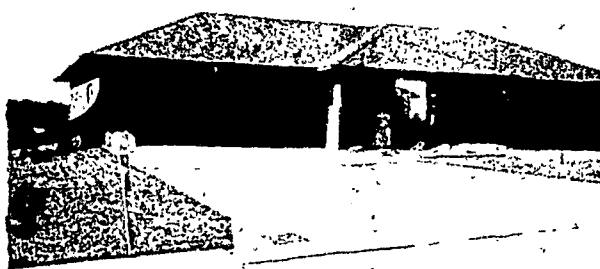
