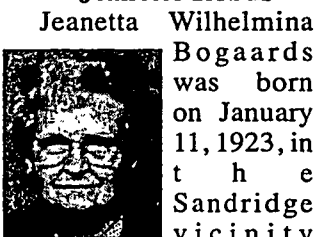


Overleden/Obituaries

Jeanette Wilhelmina Bogaards was born on January 11, 1923, in the Sandridge vicinity north of Pella, Iowa. She was the sixth of seven children that were born to Abraham and Johanna Van Heukelom Bogaards. Jeanette attended the Sandridge Country Grade School. As a young girl, her mother taught her to be a conscientious housekeeper which she practiced her entire life. On January 4, 1940, she was united in marriage with Norman Hall Robus at Otley, Iowa. To this union four children were born: Janice Arlene, Kenneth Eugene, Duane Ray and Connie Jo. Norman and Jeanette farmed in the Fifield vicinity and near Otley, Iowa all their married life. In 1962, they moved east of Otley where they were living when Norman passed away unexpectedly March 15, 1985, at the age of 66 years. Jeanette and Norman were looking forward to moving into Pella, Iowa the first of April, 1985. Jeanette continued with their plans and moved into 604 West Second Street. Although their lives' plans changed, she adjusted gracefully and her attitude never faltered. She never met a stranger and her home was always open. She meticulously and tediously continued doing housework for various families until her death. Jeanette enjoyed going on trips with friends. For many years, she had been a member of the Otley Reformed Church in Otley where she had taught with family night activities and had been a member of the Banner Bearers. having just recently celebrated her 88th birthday with her family whom she dearly loved.

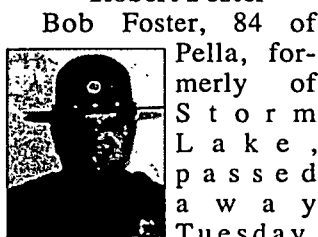

Bob Foster, 84 of Pella, formerly of Storm Lake, passed away Tuesday, January 25th, 2011 at the Long Term Care facility at Pella Regional Health Center in Pella, Iowa.

Bob was born on October 12, 1926 in Marshalltown, Ia. to James Foster & Bernice (Anderson) Foster. He lived in Marshalltown until his freshman year in high school and moved to Union, Ia. to stay with his maternal grandparents. Upon graduating in 1944 from Union, he joined the U.S. Navy where he served 4 years as radioman in Hawaii & Adak, Alaska. After being honorably discharged from the military; he moved back to Union where he and Coleen Clemens were married on Jan. 24th, 1948. To this union, three children were born; two sons, Terry & Scott and daughter Rona.

Bob worked at the Marshalltown Times Republican newspaper office until 1951. He then joined the Iowa State Patrol; first stationed in Parkersburg, Ia. In 1959, Bob transferred to Knoxville, Ia., then to Storm Lake in 1965, where he began his career as a patrol pilot ("Bear in the Air"). Bob worked in Storm Lake until 1983. He then retired, having accumulated over 10,000 hours in the air as a pilot and providing 31 years of patrol service to the State of Iowa. After retirement, he served as a security guard at IBP in Storm Lake and was employed as an insurance adjuster with Grinnell Mutual.

Bob also served as Charter President of the

J.C. Organization in Parkersburg and became a Master in the Mason's Organization. He also was a loyal member of the Elks Lodge in Storm Lake. Bob enjoyed playing golf and cards, boating, photography and spending time in their lake home on the shores of Storm Lake. He also had a strong passion for music and dance. He was known for being a jokester and quite popular for his occasional fly overs with the airplane, and creating his crafty lawn ornament presentation during the holiday seasons throughout the years. He truly loved his family and will be missed by all that knew him.

Bob is preceded in death by his grandparents, parents, and son Terry. He is survived by his wife Coleen, son Scott (Mary Jo) Foster of Pella, Ia. and daughter Rona (Donnie) Loss of Algona, Ia, his 7 grandchildren; 3 step-grandchildren; and 5 great-grandchildren.

Cremation took place per his wishes and a celebration of Bob's life for family and friends was held Saturday, January 29, 2011 at the Van Dyk-Duven Funeral Home in Pella.
